1013 Front Avenue, Saint Paul, MN

The bar scenes in Grumpy Old Men were filmed at this popular Irish bar in the Como Park area of St. Paul, MN.



**331 Club**

In "Grumpier Old Men", the exterior of Slippery's Bar was filmed at this popular night spot that oozes old-school vibes!

**Paisley Park Studios**  
7801 Audubon Rd, Chanhassen, MN

The interior shots of the homes in the movies were shot at Paisley Park, home of the legendary musician and Minnesota native, Prince. Paisley Park is now open for tours!



**Hyacinth Avenue East, Saint Paul, MN**

This is the street that Max, John, and Ariel lived on. So many of the exterior scenes in Grumpy Old Men were shot here and 30+ years later it still looks like the movie.



**John Gustafson's House**  
1133 Hyacinth Avenue East, St. Paul MN

John's house was right next door to his frenemy Max Goldman. John was played by iconic Hollywood actor Jack Lemmon.



**Max Goldman's House**  
1137 Hyacinth Avenue East, St. Paul, MN

Max was played by another Hollywood icon Walter Matthau and his home in the film was located near the intersection of Hyacinth Ave East and North Frank Street.



**Ariel Truax's House**  
1122 Hyacinth Avenue East, St. Paul, MN

The Hollywood bombshell Ann-Margret starred as Ariel in these films. Her character's stately white house is on a little hill across the street from the Grumpy Old Men of Wabasha :)



**Cooper's Foods**  
633 Seventh Street West, St Paul, MN

Grandpa Gustafson played by the hilarious Burgess Meredith always took an unusual and hilarious approach to shopping at this West St. Paul grocery store!



**Bakery**  
1116 Rice Street, St. Paul, MN

This is the spot where Jake and Melanie visited to review the wedding cake that their father's picked out!



**Marine Garage**  
180 Judd Street, Marine on St. Croix, MN

In Grumpier Old Men, Max and John pass Marine Garage on their way to church.



**Lake Rebecca Park Reserve**

Max and John spent much of their day hanging out on the lake ice fishing.
